Emeritus Professor David Carment, A.M.

The Annual History Citation, awarded by the History Council of NSW, recognises and honours an individual who has made a significant and lifelong contribution to the profession and practice of history. For 2017 the History Council of NSW is pleased to award the Annual History Citation to Emeritus Professor David Carment, in recognition of his outstanding contributions to historical scholarship, and his generosity and unwavering commitment to supporting the history community, including mentoring its emerging professionals.

Emeritus Professor David Carment has displayed remarkable dedication and generosity to the history and heritage community over his distinguished career. He is recognised as one of Australia's leading experts on North Australian history and has been widely published on this topic.

During his time at Charles Darwin University, Northern Territory, Professor Carment was Dean of the Faculty of Law, Business and Arts. He also served on many committees and boards including those of the Professional Historians Association (Northern Territory) and the National Trust of Australia (Northern Territory).

In 2008 he was made Emeritus Professor at Charles Darwin University, 'in recognition of his distinguished service to the University, outstanding contributions to the advancement of northern Australian history, and commitment to the communities of the Northern Territory'.

His tireless service to the history community continued beyond his retirement from the university. He is a former President of the Australian Historical Association, the Royal Australian Historical Society and the History Council of NSW. During 2015, 2016 and 2017 he was a judge for the NSW Premier's History Awards. In 2003, his service to the community was publicly recognised when he was made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM).
