- have been awarded or have submitted a PhD
- not hold, or have previously held, any continuing academic appointment in a university
- provide verification that you satisfy the above criteria.

Other selection criteria include:

- teaching experience at undergraduate and/or postgraduate level
- experience in the preparation of assessment and teaching materials and course development
- experience in the coordination of large units of study in ancient history, including experience working with Blackboard
- ability to work cooperatively with others in a team environment
- ability to work accurately and efficiently while ensuring high attention-to-detail
- familiarity with current innovations in educational practice.

- capability of teaching Greek.
